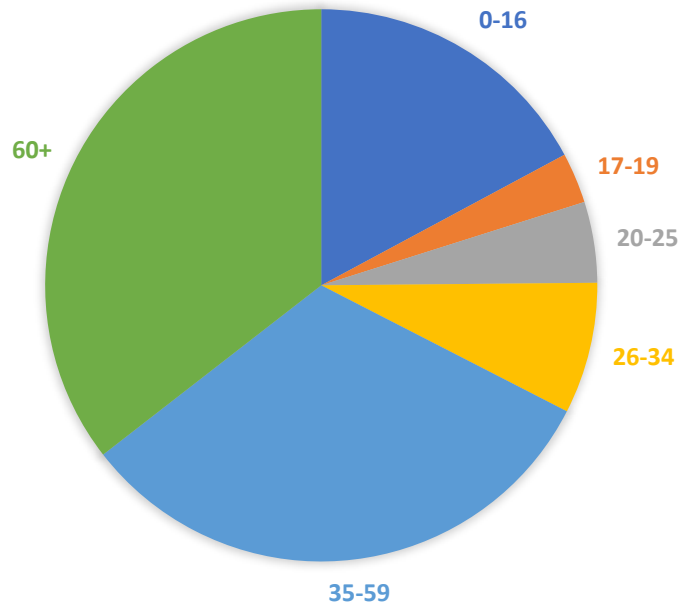
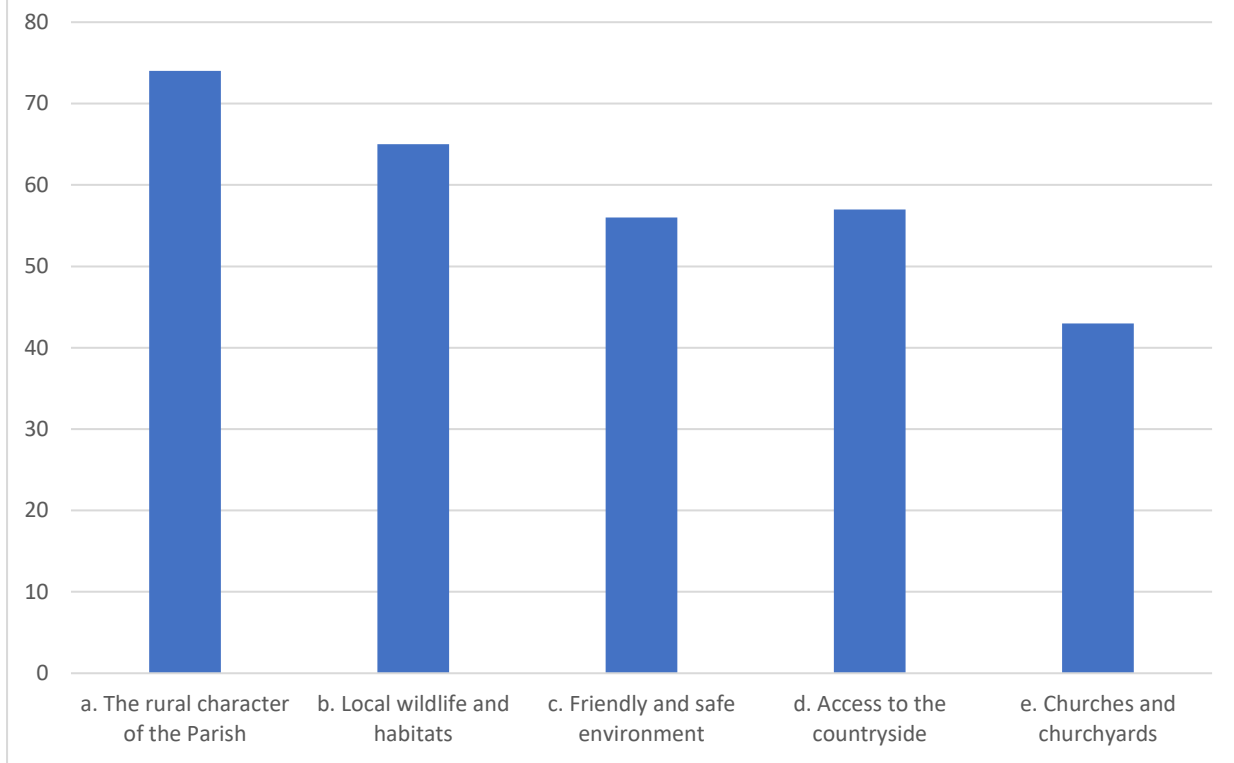


HOUSEHOLD INFORMATION 1.2 AGE RANGE OF POPULATION

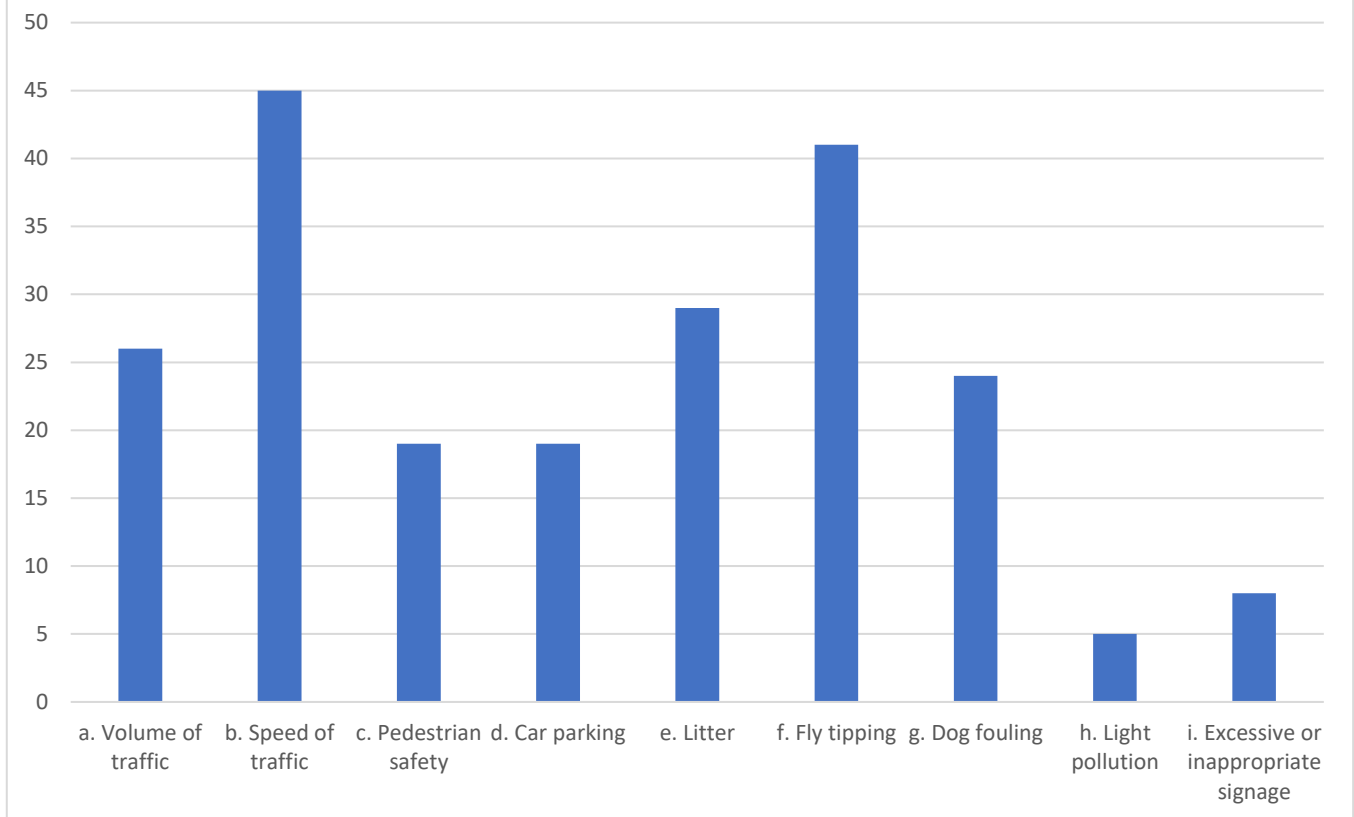
2.1 What do you feel are the strengths or positive features of our Parish?

Overdevelopment; unsustainable housing, solar energy farms and wind turbines

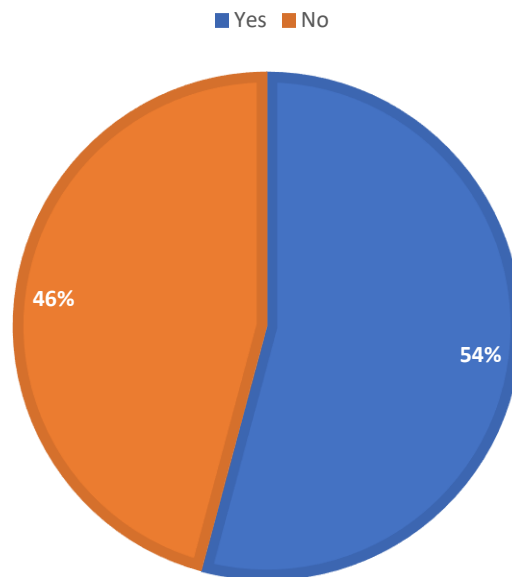
Unsustainable number of second or holiday homes, affects community and demographic; schools and facilities

Poor services; broadband, public transport, police support with increased crime

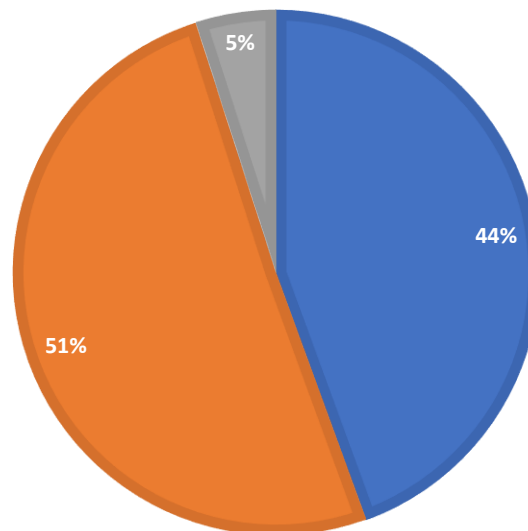

3.2 WHERE SHOULD ANY DEVELOPMENT BE LOCATED?

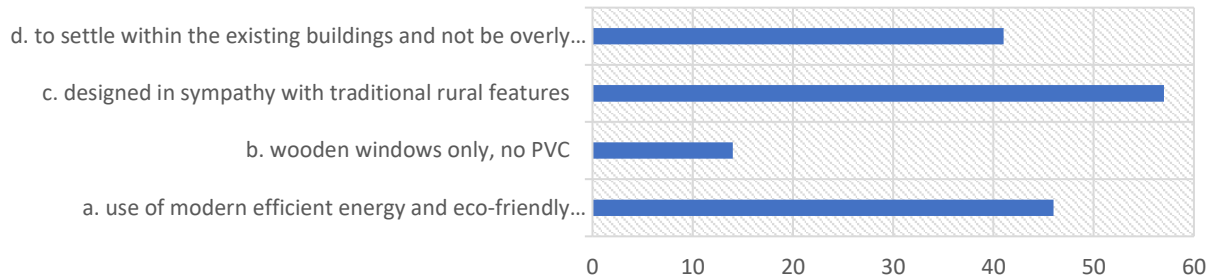

To summarise recurring comments made:

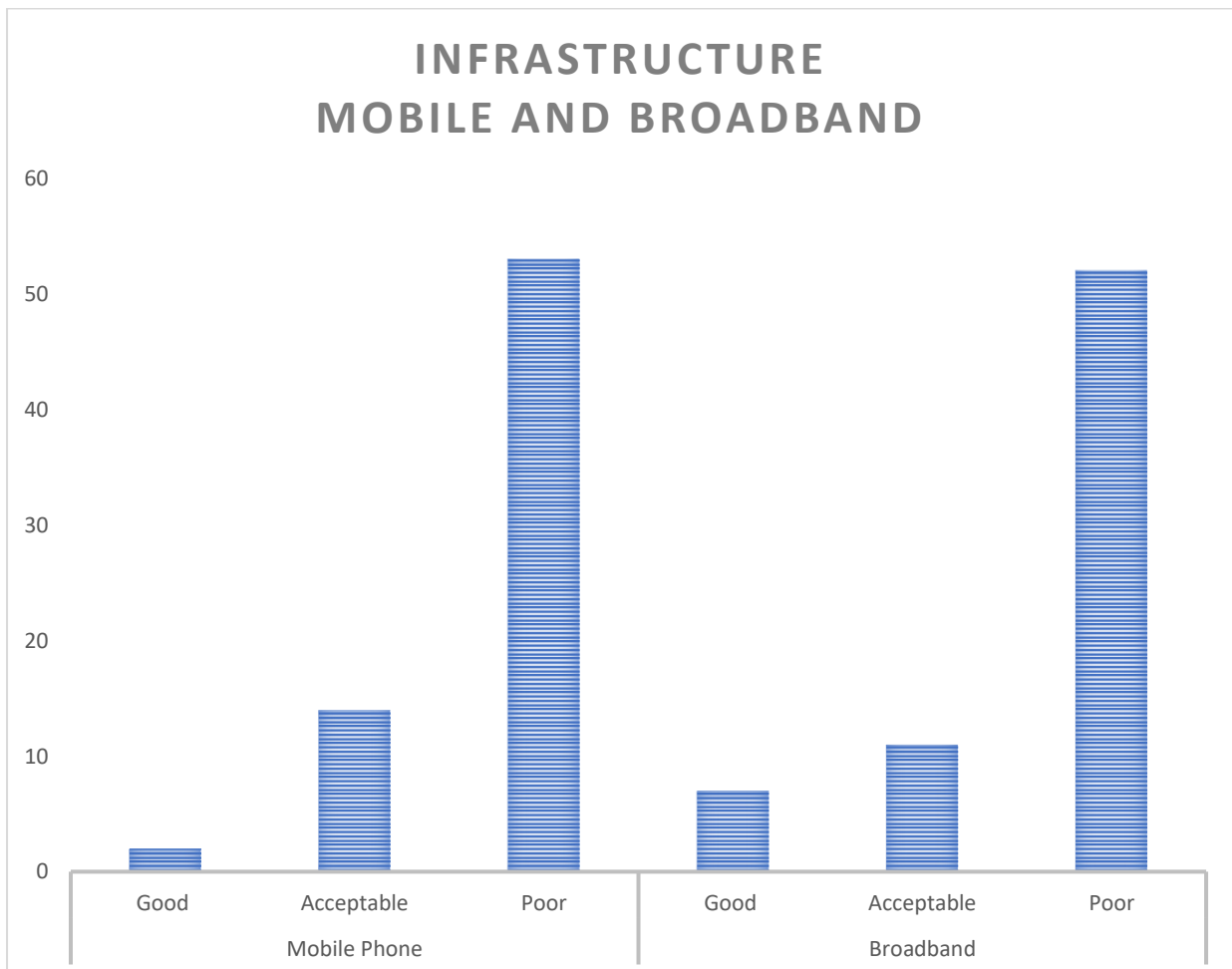
Too many vacant second and holiday homes affecting local housing
