	<p>Councillor Hancock (Chairman) paid tribute to Cllr Flynn Pearce who sadly passed away on the 23rd December. He said she had been a dedicated and hard working coucillor and before her illness was actively involved on the Neighbourhood Plan Committee. She will be greatly missed by all on the council. He sends his condolences to Roger and the family.</p> <p>Chairman to open the meeting by welcoming the pubic and councillors.</p> <p>Chairman to invite the public to address the meeting on any items on the agenda.</p> <p>John Hancock went through the proposed planting sites for trees associated with the Queens Canopy, members had reservations about a couple of sites but John said that arrangements would be to inspect the proposed sites in the near future.</p> <p>Rory & Mylo from the Earthbound project which is based at St Cadix wanted to make the council aware of the projects aims. The project is a market garden type project producing fresh fruit and vegetables to the local community, they would also be selling fresh eggs. The Chairman thanked them for coming and wished them good luck with their venture.</p>

The clerk read a report from PCSO Steve Cocks saying there were no crimes in the parish during December and numerous patrols had been carried out and all appeared in order.</p> <p>(b) Cornwall Council. Cllr Martin spoke on a number of issues which include the approval of the Climate Emergency Plan which had been approved, he said that he had been pushing for Newquay Airport to be Net Zero but this still not including the planes. Health and Social Care is still a great problem in Cornwall. Cornwall Council is reducing the number of Community Network Panels which will result in this parish being part of a much wider area. If the Parish Council wanted to arrange a meeting to discuss the devolution deal, he would be willing to come along.</p> <p>He asked if there had been any progress with Lowertown bridge, he was told that notices had been erected on the main bridge and the clerk had emailed Corwall Highways enquiring if these had been put at the wrong bridge but no reply had been received.
